Melbourne-based British designer Dean Norton debuted his collection stateside with this Containa plinth at Alcova Miami.

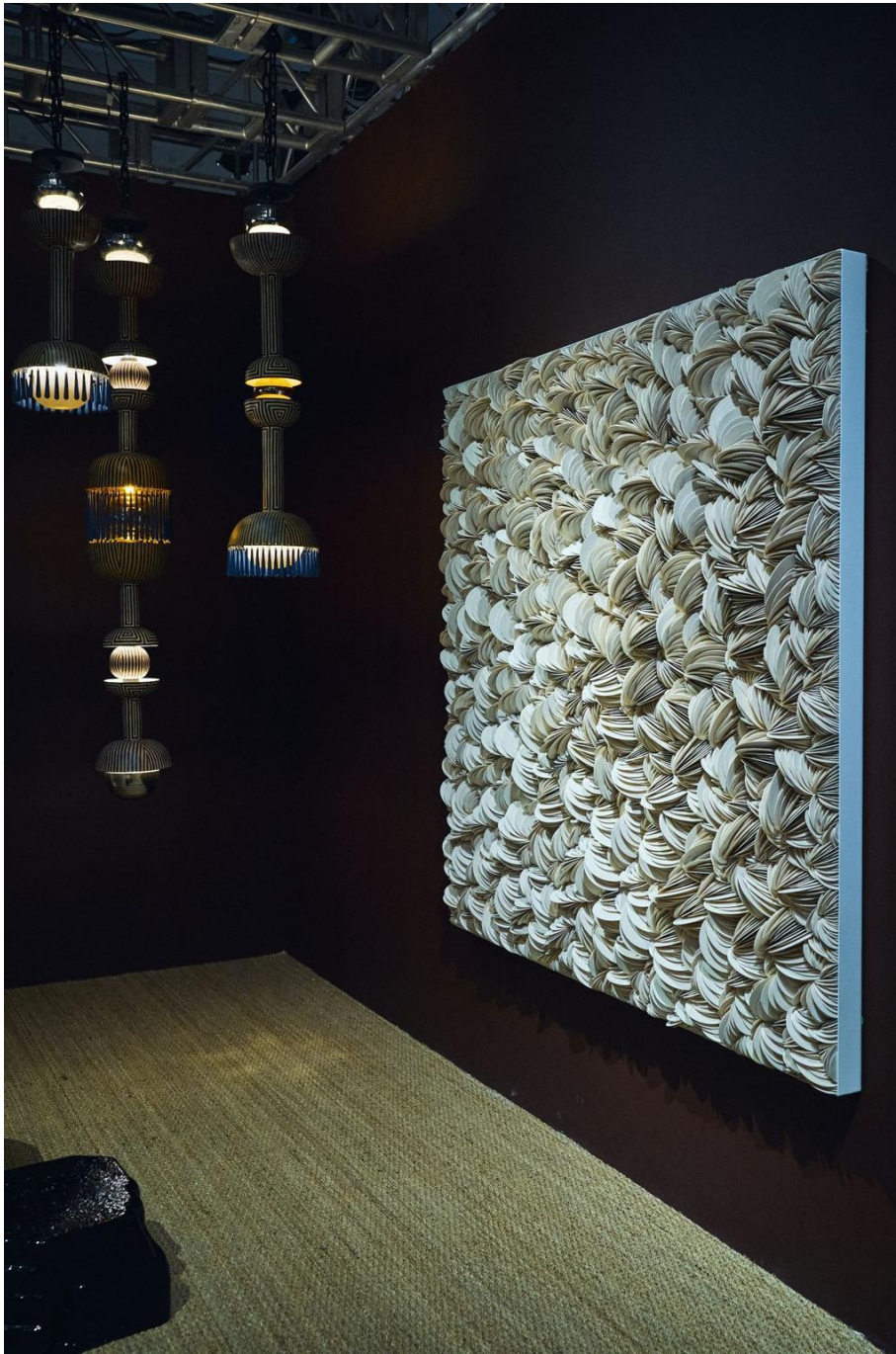
