With an artistic career spanning over two decades, Gregory Nangle lives and works in the Fishtown neighborhood of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Nangle owns and operates Outcast Studios, a 10,000 sq. ft. space dedicated to bronze casting and glass bending. Over the last several years, he has been commissioned to create custom works around NYC and many of his works are now in private collections around the country. Nangle explores the intersection of geometry and natural forms within his designs. His work juxtaposes Minimalist geometry with forms or essences derived from nature.
